MO 21-02 Railway Locomotive Inspection and Safety Rules and the Canadian Rail Operating Rules	Issued March 10, 2021, requires railway companies and local railway companies to amend the <i>Railway Locomotive</i> <i>Inspection and Safety Rules</i> and the <i>Canadian Rail Operating Rules</i> . MO 20-08 <i>Canadian Rail Operating Rules</i> Rule 66	Issued April 27, 2020, pursuant to section 32.01 of the <i>Railway Safety Act</i> , regarding the reporting of emergency brake applications to the Minister of Transport. Currently, an emergency brake application is not considered to be a reportable rail occurrence. Therefore, in the interests of safe railway operations and in order to monitor the implementation of Rule 66 of the <i>Canadian Rail Operating Rules</i> (CROR) approved by the Minister of Transport on April 24, 2020, all companies of MO 20-08 are required to report all occurrences of an emergency brake application that occur when a train is stopped on heavy or mountain grade to Transport Canada. <u>https://tc.canada.ca/en/rail-transportation/enforcement-action-measures-mitigate-threats-rail-safety/ministerial-orders-emergency-directives/order-pursuant-section-3201-railway-safety-act-mo-20-08</u>			This reporting will begin on July 1, 2020, and last for 12 months until July 1, 2021
MO 20-07 Rules Respecting Track Safety	Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 19(1)(a) of the RSA, the railway companies are ordered to revise the <i>Rules Respecting Track Safety</i> (TSR) in 3 phases. Phase 1: Rule amendments related to phase 1 were filed and approved, February 1, 2022. Phase 2: The RAC's working group are currently working on these revisions (Track Inspection Frequency, Automated Tack Inspection Technology).
