Manitoba has extended the April and May tax filing deadlines until June 22, 2020 for small and medium businesses with monthly RST remittances of no more than \$10,000. Businesses that file on a quarterly basis that have a due date of April 20, 2020 have had the due date extended to June 22, 2020.	The Manitoba government is investing \$27.6 million to help provide childcare to essential front-line workers who need it as they support the province's COVID-19 response.	Public health officials are strongly advising all Manitobans, including health-care providers, to cancel or postpone any non- essential travel. This includes international travel and travel within Canada. There should be no recreational, tourist or non- essential personal travel. In addition, public health officials recommended that effective March 23, anyone who returns from international or domestic travel should self-isolate and self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days following their return.
