On April 15 th , the B.C. government formally extended the provincial state of emergency through the end of the day on April 28 th , 2020. The Saskatchewan Workers Compensation Board (WCB) is waiving premium penalties for employers effective April 1 until June 30, 2020. Manitoba has extended the April and May tax filing deadlines until June 22, 2020 for small and medium businesses with monthly RST remittances of no more than \$10,000. Businesses that file on a quarterly basis that have a due date of April 20, 2020 have had the due date extended to June 22, 2020.	The Manitoba government is investing \$27.6 million to help provide childcare to essential front-line workers who need it as they support the province's COVID-19 response.	Public health officials are strongly advising all Manitobans, including health-care providers, to cancel or postpone any non- essential travel. This includes international travel and travel within Canada. There should be no recreational, tourist or non- essential personal travel.
