

CANADA'S RAIL FREIGHT RATES ARE AMONGST WORLD'S LOWEST[®]



Canada's high-performing freight rail system has among the lowest freight rates in the entire world – lower than the U.S., other western countries in Europe, Japan, and India. Canadians rely on an efficient and competitive freight rail system with industry-leading safety performance, high levels of private sector capital investment, pioneering innovation, and a cost-competitive transportation service.

CANADIAN RAIL FREIGHT RATES ARE 11 PERCENT LOWER LOWER THAN U.S.



FACTS ABOUT CANADA'S FREIGHT RAILWAYS

SAFETY

Canadian Class 1s are industry leaders in safety and have lower train accident frequencies than their U.S. counterparts.

RESILIENCY

Over the past decade, railways have invested more than \$20 billion - nearly 25% of every dollar earned - to enhance the fluidity and resiliency of Canada's rail network.

RELIABILITY

Canada's railways reliably transport \$350 billion dollars of goods each year and bring 50% of our country's exports to market.
